“To finish with the oldest generation, there was yet another veteran of 1830, old [Captain Wojciechowski](#), called usually **Captain Francis**, an old companion of Piotrowski. It was at his place that Sienkiewicz took up his abode when he left Anaheim. I did not know him so well, but he was spoken of very highly, and they say that Sienkiewicz reproduced some of the features of his personality in another great character in his "Fire and Sword, the wonderful and heroic "[Longinus] [Podbipięta](#)," for like him he was more than commonly tall, very thin, and reserved by disposition.”

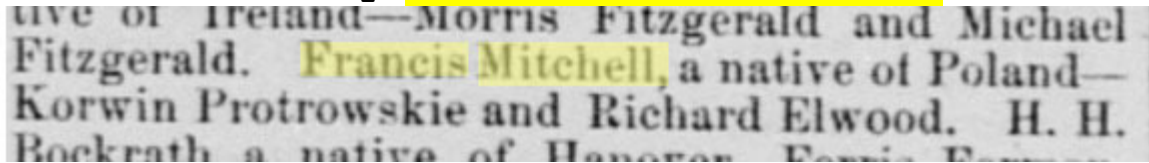

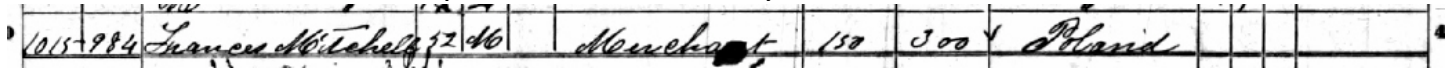

MEETING OF POLES—SYMPATHY WITH THEIR STRUGGLING COUNTRYMEN, ETC., ETC.—Last evening a large number of the Polish residents of San Francisco assembled at the Russ House for the purpose of expressing sympathy with their countrymen, now fighting to free their land from the tyranny of Russian despotism. A Committee had been previously elected, whose duty it will be to devise ways and means of enlisting general interest amongst Americans, resident in California, as will convince their struggling brethren that the popular feeling here is with them in their efforts to regain their national independence.

The names of this Committee are as follows, the President acting as Chairman of the meeting:

President, Kazmir Bielarbski; Vice-Presidents, Francis Urycishowski, Leon Czaykowski, and Rev. Max Wolfe; Acting Agent on Communications, Rudolf Corwin Piotrowski.

Besides the above there are twelve other acting members of the Society.

The President, in stating the objects of the meeting, remarked that he was pleased to see such large representations from different nations present. They were there to express their sympathy with the heroic struggles of Poland to regain her national independence. Able speakers were present to address them, and he would introduce first Mr. Piotrowski.

MORE RUNAWAYS.—Between seven and eight o'clock yesterday morning the horse of Vincent Tortell, while attached to a wagon, started off prematurely and threw out the driver, who was at the time arranging his seat. The accident occurred on K street, near Second. Tortell fell on his head and was severely injured. At noon a span of horses, belonging to **Captain Francis of Sebastopol**, became frightened while in front of Milliken's store, at Third and K streets. The driver, a man named Gorebekow, in trying to stop the team, was knocked down and run over, but was not dangerously hurt. The horses ran up K street to Eighth, where they damaged two wagons at Robinson's blacksmith-shop to the extent of eleven dollars, which their owner paid, and were brought to a halt. During their run the neck yoke broke, which let the tongue fall to the ground and essentially impeded their course.

Francis Mischell testified—Known plaintiff's place since 1855-6. Don't call the low land bottom land, but there may have been 18 or 20 acres of level land there. Can raise nothing there without irrigation. Plaintiff's land is now better than before. In 1870 the creek was open so water ran through it. There was a long slough on the south side of the creek in 1855-6; it was 10 or 15 steps wide and very long. It was not on the Clark place.

For several years he has traveled extensively over the State, and after a careful investigation of the advantages of the different cities, gives it as his opinion that Sacramento is not excelled by any portion of the Golden State.

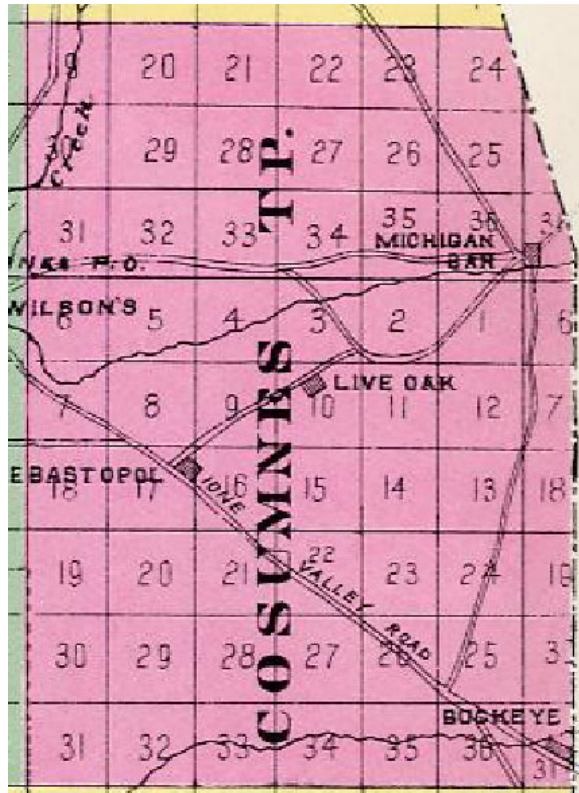

"SEBASTOPOL. A mining camp, established in 1854, is located on the N. W. of Sec. 16, T. 7 N. B. 8 E. The name Sebastopol was chosen by a vote of the miners, the Crimean war being then in progress, and its famous namesake being very prominent in the daily papers of that date. From 1854 to 1858, the camp thrived, population and buildings increased. Mining, however, being the main industry, with its decline the town gradually became deserted, till at the present time there are but four houses standing. During the lively times, from three to four hundred ounces of gold dust were sold weekly at this place. Hydraulic mining has not yet been introduced here, all the mines being surface or placer diggings. Since 1859 there have been no white men at work mining here. Some Chinamen, however, worked until 1876. At one time Sebastopol contained one hotel, one general merchandise store, one dry goods store, one saloon and bowling alley, one cigar store, butcher shop, blacksmith shop, shoe store, and dwelling-houses and miners' cabins containing about two hundred inhabitants. Among some of the early settlers were Michael Davis, McEntire, T. P. Horn, Dr. Bowman, Lyon, McCabe and Francis Mitchell (aka **Franciszek Michał Wojciechowski**). The latter came when the town was established and still resides here. There is some good agricultural land in the vicinity, but at present not much of it under cultivation."
