In January 1849 he served as a non-commissioned volunteer in the ulan division/troop organized by cavalry captain Poniński whose volunteers earlier belonged to a Polish battalion; ordered to help troops which mobbed Arad. He fought throughout all of the Spring campaign. On the 26th of May general Wysocki nominated Lessen for a promotion to second lieutenant in the first ulan regiment. On the 16th of May he became second lieutenant (officially confirmed on the 13th of June). In Orszowa he was awarded the Order of Merit (Grade III) by Kossuth. Kossuth wrote that Lessen served with bravery and self-sacrifice, was hurt many times, and that he was a role model. His most important battles were: Solnok, Komarom and Segedyn – where he was injured again. After the Hungarian Uprising he went to the Ottomon Empire. In Camp Szumlam he was promoted to lieutenant. In the Spring of 1850 (17th of March) Lessen was with the first Polish group **commanded by Zamoyski** that went through Constantinople and Malta to England. On the 5th of June after travel in stormy weather he arrived in Southampton, and from there **on the 20th of June he left for the United States**. –Source: Professor **István Kovács from Hungary**

On the 15th of August 1853 he joined Towarzystwo Wygnańców Polskich w Ameryce (Society of Polish Exiles in America). In 1854 he lived in New York. He belonged to the **Pacific Club** in San Francisco (The Pacific-Union Club was a **consolidation of the Pacific Club and the Union Club**, two pioneer social organizations in San Francisco. The Pacific Club was established in 1852 and the Union Club in 1854. They are among the oldest clubs in seniority in the United States).

He may have lived in Australia for a time. He was reportedly a captain in the US army (???). In September of 1863 he is reported to have enlisted to join Poland's January Uprising (from Melbourne to Europe), **but this is unconfirmed and may be another person**. –Source: Professor István Kovács from Hungary

SIR: I have the honor to inform you that the Alaska Commercial Company's schooner *William Sutton* touched at the seal islands, Alaska, on the 4th of October last, for the purpose of taking to San Francisco Messrs. Mossman and Davidson, of that place, two carpenters, who had been employed in building the native church. By this mail I received a brief report from **Francis Lessen**, esq., assistant Treasury agent in charge of St. Paul Island, containing information of the condition of that island two months later than I left, August 9, the following of which is a copy:

Rudolf Korwin Piotrowski wrote: "There is here a certain **Capt Lessen**, who is an agent of the government on the islands, of furs on the Bhering sea [sic]. He could also write you interesting enough descriptions of those islands and inhabitants[,] wildlife and commerce. So give the word and we shall be of service, and maybe, though from our work you will make but a single little brick, you will add it to your undying monument to posterity. I close with an expression of heartfelt friendship and deep respect.

THE FAIR LAND OF POLAND.
Reunion of the Descendants of that Country—A Pleasant Entertainment.
On Wednesday evening, the Polish Society of California gave an entertainment at Charter Oak Hall, on Market street, in commemoration of the struggle for independence in 1830-1.
The meeting was presided over by Messrs. Pietrowski and Bednawski, veterans who had participated in the memorable conflict. The President called the meeting to order, and in stating its object, invited all present to sit down to a table spread with choicest viands provided by a special committee of two members, viz.: Messrs. Kryzanowski and Captain Lessen.
After dinner the President, Mr. Pietrowski, delivered a very able and interesting address, which was followed by a number of short but spirited speeches delivered by various members of the Company. Speaking of the object of the meeting, Vice-President Bednawski said: "To speak of the chief aim of the meeting: It is true, Poland has no political existence. The Poles have no longer a country to fight for or defend—they have lost everything but the honor and faith in retributive justice, which sooner or later, must be triumphant—but at the bottom of the question of Poland's future, there is involved the great cause of public justice and national independence, which is the common cause of all freemen. And certainly, it is the cause of all causes. The Poles, although citizens of this country, and owing allegiance to her alone as freemen, have not only rights, but it is their duty to protest vehemently and at all times against the perfidy and violence of the partitioning powers."
The remainder of the evening was spent chiefly in friendly conversation and patriotic songs. The meeting came to a close at 11 P. M., the members dispersing amid cheers and mutual congratulations.

Committee of Resolutions

COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS.

A Committee of five, consisting of Capt. C. Bielawski, General Krzyzanowski, Mr. Choynski, Captain Lessen and Professor A. Elgass, were appointed to draw up resolutions for a meeting two weeks hence, said resolutions, if approved, to be forwarded to our representatives in Congress, with a request that they be delivered to the President of the United States, and to the Chairman in the Senate and House on Foreign Relations. Mr. Choynski delivered a spirited address on the grievances of Poland. He was confident, however, that our Government would follow the example of Great Britain and protest against those wanton murders. Professor Elgass read extracts from Polish and German papers, and courteously translated their telling points for the benefit of the reporters present, after which the meeting adjourned.

President, Captain **Piotrowski**, was the first speaker, giving a short and very interesting history of the Revolution, in which he himself participated. He was followed by Professor A. Elgass, Secretary of the Polish Society, who read several letters of prominent Poles from different parts of the State, and added to them a eulogy of the prominent participants in the Revolution. Speeches were also made by Captain C. Bielawski, Dr. W. Pawlicki, Captain F. Lessen, Mr. T. Horain, La Borne, and others. Mr. Joseph Pandler, the poet of the evening, read an exquisite poem composed by him for the occasion, describing the battles and the heroes of the Revolution. One of the features of the evening was the speech of Gov. E. S. Salomon, one of the invited guests, in which some of the most interesting events of that memorable Revolution were vividly described, and the speaker showed himself, to the delight of the many Poles present, thoroughly conversant with the history of their country. The Polish Revolution of 1830, although Poland did not succeed in freeing her people from Russian oppression, was a series of brilliant victories and glorious deeds of
