# Among First to Die on Both Sides— Poles Were Valiant in Civil War

EDITOR'S NOTE: This story of the patriotism of Polish immigrants in the United States at the time of recruitment for the Civil war was written by Jerome Razewski, a member of the Polish Welfare Council of Schenectady County and a member of the county's Civil war centennial committee. The Polish immigrants were so deeply drawn into the inner life of the United States that they could not remain strangers in the great crisis of the nation that culminated in a civil war.

AT THE TIME of the Civil war, there were 30,000 Poles in the U.S. and of this number 5,000 fought in the ranks of the Union army, while 1,000 served with the Confederate troops.

By sheer coincidence, the Poles were among the first to die on both sides in battle. According to official records. Thaddeus Strawinski, an 18-year-old student, was the first to die in the Confederate attack on Fort Sumter off Charleston, S.C. And the first Union officer to be killed was Captain Constantine Blandowski, who helped save Missouri for the union.

There were many altempts to organize Polish units during the war. The Polish volunteers in the "Polish Legion." otherwise known as the 58th New York Volunteer Infantry, everted great efforts to
