POLISH SOCIETY IS FORMED IN OAKLAND

Foreign Born Residents of East Bay Cities Join Hands

OAKLAND, Dec. 7.—Polish speaking residents of the east bay shore cities met Monday evening at the home of Albert A. Bednarz, 936 Telegraph avenue, and formed the Polish society of Oakland.

The organization aims to encourage a closer intimacy with the Polish language, its literature and traditions, and to strengthen the bonds of friendship among the Poles of America.

The following officers were elected: President, Hugo Henry Lillenthal; secretary, Felix A. Kuczynski; treasurer, Albert A. Bednarz.

A committee was elected to draft a constitution and bylaws. Its report will be received at the society's next meeting, Monday night, at the same place.
