

Funeral of the Reverend Thomas Starr King, 1864

TRIBUTES OF RESPECT TO THE MEMORY OFME. KING In honor to the memory of the late Rev. Thomas Starr King, Gen. Wright has ordered the fiags at the several posts in this harbor, and at Department headquarters, to be at half-mast during the day, and minute guns to be fired from Alcatraz during the funeral observation-more.

The Cuslom-house, Mint, Postoffice, and public buildings generally are closed to-day, and from these throughout the city and among the shipping, flags are still kept at half-mast. The various societies and associations of the city are not backward in demonstrations of respect to the memory of the late Mr. King. The San Francisco Stock and Exchange Board of Brokers adjourned its regular meeting to-day until half-past 3 o'clock, and the Pacific Board adjourned over until Monday.




