Greenberg; Representative for the Interior, C. Piotrowski; and also appointed a Committee to take proper steps to call a mass meeting as soon as practicable.

MEETING OF THE POLISH ASSOCIATION.—The friends of Poland held a meeting last evening at their headquarters, corner of Montgomery and Bush streets, which was very largely attended. Corvin Piotrowsky called the meeting to order. Capt. Bielawsky was elected Chairman and J. W. Andrzejowsky Secretary. A report of the doings of the Executive Polish Committee for this coast was read and adopted. Communications were read from delegates at the East and placed on file. Addresses were made by J. W. Andrzejowsky, Joseph Newman, C. Vellimiro, J. Wolfson, Corvin Piotrowsky and others. A good deal of enthusiasm was excited, a handsome collection taken up, and arrangements made to induce further subscription.

Funeral of the Reverend Thomas Starr King, 1864

TRIBUTES OF RESPECT TO THE MEMORY OF MR. KING
In honor to the memory of the late Rev. Thomas Starr King, Gen. Wright has ordered the flags at the several posts in this harbor, and at Department headquarters, to be at half-mast during the day, and minute guns to be fired from Alcatraz during the funeral ceremonies to-morrow.

The Custom-house, Mint, Postoffice, and public buildings generally are closed to-day, and from these, throughout the city and among the shipping, flags are still kept at half-mast. The various societies and associations of the city are not backward in demonstrations of respect to the memory of the late Mr. King. The San Francisco Stock and Exchange Board of Brokers adjourned its regular meeting to-day until half-past 3 o'clock, and the Pacific Board adjourned over until Monday.

A CASE OF ASPHYXIATION.

An Old Gentleman Suffocated by Escaping Gas.

About 8 A.M. yesterday when the granddaughter of J. J. Mundwyler, living with his son at 1419 Twenty-fourth street went to call him to breakfast he made no response, and she opened the door. A rush of gas from the room nearly overpowered her, but she saw the body of her grandfather in the bed with foam around his lips, and a flaccid face. She gave the alarm and an investigation showed that the old gentleman had been asphyxiated. Dr. Thrallock was called and worked on the body for over an hour without causing it to show any sign of life, so the Coroner was notified. In Mr. Mundwyler's room there are two jets on the same fixture. He evidently attempted unsuccessfully to light one, as a half burnt match on the floor shows. The match went out before he could succeed. But he left the stop-cock turned full on. Lighting another match he apparently forgot that gas was still flowing from one jet, and turned on the other and lit it. He then retired, with the above fatal result.

The deceased was seventy-three years of age and a native of Switzerland. He was comfortably well-off, apparently happy and had no possible reason to commit suicide.
