Krzyzanowski, who was recently appointed as Inspector of Customs at New York, is an active Republican, a reporter asked Secretary Manning about it. 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# WLADIMIR KRZYZANOWSKI.

Wiadimir Krzyzanowski, one of the foreign political exiles who made their mark in the civil war in this country, died early yes erday at his home. No. 870 Lexing on-ave. He had been ill for about a year from Bright's disease, complicated with injuries received at the battle of Gettysburg and he has been confined to his bed for over two months. The funeral will be held at his home to-morow at 2 p. m. and Carl Schurz is expected to speak. The burnel will be at Greenwood, with military honors from several Grand Army posts.

General Krzyzanowski was born at Raznova, in Polish Prussia, on July 8, 1824. He took an active part in the attempt made to ré-establish Polish autonomy, and when the revolutionary schemes were crushed he fled to America in 1846. He was engaged part of the time in commercial business before the civil war broke out, and also did civil-engineering work on some of the western rail-roads. When Fort Samter was fired on he or-ganized a company of the Tarner Rifles, receiv-ing a captain's commission on May 9, 1861. In September he was made colonel of the 58th New-York Volunteers, which regiment he organized, and he served with the Army of the Potomac through the War, retiring with the brevet title of brigadier-general. For some years after the War he held military service under the Government in Alabama, Georgia and Alaska. He was in the Customs service in the Isthmus of Panama for 1883 some time, but in he . made Was n special in the New-York ugent Custom House, His removal a year or so ago met with such clamor on account of his war services that he was reinstated. He organized the Steinwehr Post No. 192 of the G. A. R. and was warmly interested in the order. In politics he was an ardent and active Republican, and he made many friends by his genial and loyal spirit. He leaves no family.



The contest of Antanina Borkowska Ogonowska, claiming to be a niece of Palagia Maria Kryzanowsky, against the latter's will, was answered yesterday by Charles A. Rickman, administrator of the estate of Charles F. G. Rickman. The latter died May 20, 1904. With the exception of a few charitable bequests Rickman was left all of the estate by the woman, who declared that she had no relatives. Her estate was worth about \$35,000 and a contest was brought by Maria Nightengale, who pretended to be a daughter. This contest was compromised for \$10,000 and later the Nightengale

woman appeared as contestant in another estate. The Rickman answer now denies that Antonina Ongonowska is a niece or any relative of Palagia Krzyzanowsky and denies that at the time of making her will she had a weakened or unsound mind or that her will was under the domination of Rickman.

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# Judge Kerrigan Decides in Favor of the Nephew and Niece of Mrs. Krzyanowski

A decision in favor of the nephew and niece of Palagia Maria Kryzanowski, in their contest of that eccentric woman's will, was rendered yesterday by Judge Kerrigan, who has had the case under advisement for several The winners are Aloyzy Sylweeks. vester Borkowski, who lives somewhere in Poland, and his sister, An-Ogonowska of Borkowski tonina Schenectady, N. Y. The losers are Attorney George H. Perry, to whom the interest of Charles Rickman, the deceased beneficiary under the will, was assigned, and Rickman's two sons, who would have shared in the residue after Perry had taken out his 25 per cent.

The court was satisfied with the proof of relationship of the niece and nephew and judged from the evidence that Madame Krzyanowski was incompetent to make a will, when she signed the testament leaving nearly all of her \$30,000 estate to Charles Rickman, a pickle peddler. When the will was made, the woman was in a hospital, suffering from a paralytic stroke. She died less than a month later.

Of the original \$30,000 only about \$11,000 remains and there is another obstacle in the way of its distribution to the niece and nephew." The Rickman interests hold an assignment of the rights of Marie Nightingale in the estate and now that the will has been broken, will try to prove that she is the daughter of the deceased and her heir at law. Under this claim of relationship Marie Nightingale filed a contest against the will before it was admitted to probate in February, 1903. The case was tried in Judge Troutt's court, but before it was submitted to the jury the alleged daughter accepted \$10,000 as a compromise and assigned her interest to Rickman. Perry received \$1000 for his fees and other allowances were made which reduced the estate to its present proportions.

Witnesses in the trial of the case testified that Madame Kryzanowski claimed to belong to the nobility of Poland. She was married three times and her third husband was a general in the civil war in this country. In her latter days she lived in squalor, in spite of her fortune.

She was parsimonious and no one suspected that she was possessed of means, although it is stated that she sometimes displayed diamonds and jewelry to the value of several thousand dollars. When she was stricken with her fatal illness she at first went to the County Hospital. There it was learned she was possessed of money and her friends had her removed to St. Joseph's Home, where she died. Before she died Rickman secured the services of Attorney Perry to draw up a will of the property of the dying woman in his favor. The will was signed at the deathbed and Perry and Henry W. 



If Congress moves promptly, there may yet be time for the nation to observe July 9 as "Gen. Krzyzanowski Memorial Day." A resolution introduced last week by Rep. Thomas J. Lane, D-Mass., calls on President Kennedy to proclaim the day in honor of the general.

Most Americans never heard of Wladimir B. Krzyanowski. Presumably that's why Rep. Lane introduced his resolution.

Krzyzanowski, an immigrant from Poland, was among the first to volunteer to defend the Union at the outbreak of the Civil War. Krzyzanowski rose in

rank by President Lincoln. He fought in the battles of Bull Run, Cross Keys and Gettysburg. making a distinguished record for courage and leadership. Civil War Historian Bruce Catton has said of him. "Krzyzanowski is as good an American name as Cabot.'

Americans, although descendants of immigrants, sometimes lose sight of their heritage and draw unfounded distinctions because a name may not "sound" American, "Gen. Krzyzanowski Memorial Day" would do honor to Wladimir B. Krzyzanowski and all the other Americans with foreign sounding names rank from private to brigadier who contributed to the nation's
