Polish Army Head To Be Guest Here

General Haller Accepts Legion Invitation

General Josef Haller, commanderin chief of the Polish armies, has accepted the invitation of the American Legion to attend the fifth annual national convention of the organization, to be held here October 15 to 19, it was made known yesterday.

General Haller will sail from Havre next Saturday on the steamship France, according to a cablegram received by General Hunton Liggett, general chairman of the convention committee, yesterday.

Accompanying the general will be a retinue of two colonels, two members of the Polish Society and three secretaries.

Local Polish societies contemplate a number of affairs in his honor while in this city. Following his engagement here he will be the guest of Polish war veterans in various parts of the United States.
